Probably sculptured in the eighth century of the Christian era,—they are mentioned by the earliest Mahomedan Conquerors and Historians. Mahomed Gous was a celebrated Saint, who, according to Mahomedan legends, had reduced the Planet Mars to subjection, built about 300 years ago. Disciple of the above Saint, and the most celebrated Mahomedan Singer and Composer India ever produced, he was one of the favorite companions of Acbar. A Mahomedan Saint, built about 300 years ago. Ditto ditto ditto. Mahomedan Cathedral, built by Auroungjeb, 6th of the Mogul Dynasty. Twenty-four miles from Gwalior, said to be built 1,600 years ago. Twelve ditto. The tomb of Acbar's favorite Secretary, the famous Chronicler, is now little more than a heap of ruins.

Ruins of a Fort said to be built by Vikramaditya, B. C. 57.

The place of retirement of Rajah Bhurtree, the recluse brother of Vikramaditya. Summer residence, built by Ghoree Kings of Malwa, perhaps by Hoshung, who died A. D. 1433.

Observatory, built by Rajah Jey Sing of Jeypore, Minister of Mahomed Shah, 1719, 1748,

It is conjectured that these monuments were raised to enshrine some relic, consecrated by Buddist superstition. The Bhilsa Topes need no mention here; Government is in possession of photographs and elaborate reports.

Much injured. All these have been fully described by General Cunningham in his Work on the Bhilsa Topes.

Constructed during the reign of Hoshung Shah, Ghoree, A.D. 1405-35, and considered the finest and largest specimen of Affghan architecture existing in India of rectangular shape, surmounted by a dome, and the interior 44 feet square. Each side and corner is arched,—the apartment above the arches having an octagonal appearance, and each side of the doorway is an open window with a Gothic arch. In tolerable preservation.
