I also beg to forward the list of drawings

 in my letter of the 17<sup>th</sup> instant

I hope to forward the drawings  
 noted in margin very shortly - when  
 the Plates for all Reports now with the  
 Honble Com. will have been sent in.

There will then remain for  
 completion as far as may be desired -  
 the remainder of the drawings enumerated  
 in the enclosed list, with their descriptive  
 notes etc, and the remainder of the "Relic  
 Series" which latter I shall proceed with  
 at once pending instructions from His  
 Lordship the Governor General respecting  
 the former. In addition to this I also

propose drawing up a supplementary  
 paper on the Sanchi Inscriptions / now  
 with the Asiatic Society / and the Buddhist  
 relics excavated at & near Sanchi - unless  
 His Lordship should deem the publication  
 of Major Cunningham's work to Local

rendered any further remarks from me unnecessary.

I beg to enclose Copies of Letters received from the Secretary to Government W.O. and of my reply thereto which I hope is what it should be.

The Commissioners of Revenue seem to be under the impression that I am still attached to my Regiment, and about to return to it for the cold season therefore to have nominated me for the work at Parrnath as the best qualified officer on the spot and available; whereas you are aware such is not the case, and that I am now awaiting His Lordship's orders respecting new work in other quarters and the completion of old.

I am of course quite unaware as yet what His Lordship's wishes may be, but I would beg respectfully to urge that in all work hitherto undertaken by me, what were chiefly expected from me & what I may hope to derive most success & credit from, have been drawings, and that were I allowed to choose I should naturally prefer the continuance of such varied work to that at Parrnath which I have reason to conclude would afford very little if any scope for pictorial illustration, and would therefore be less interesting to and adapted for me.

I trust His Lordship will not deem me presuming in thus expressing a preference before knowing what his views are.

Descriptive Report of all the places here mentioned other where no drawings were made with illustrative notes & have already been completed and sent home.

The MS. report upon Chauderi with illustrative notes & carvings is in my possession & only requires revision. The ruins here are almost entirely Muhammedan and not of any antiquity or of any particular interest. A few architectural details only are worthy of illustration.

Ferebān and Māmōn are mere hamlets, and of no importance except for a few specimens of Hindu and Jaina sculpture which however are not of any novelty.

The MS. report upon Kadwāho with notes & carvings is in my possession. Kadwāho has a number of Jaina Temples some very fine - of the same
