Telegraphic Message
From Calcutta 20th November 1857
From J. Edmonstone Esq
To Allahabad
To Mr. Chester - Commissioner

The friend of India of the nineteenth Inst. says that the youngest son of the King of Delhi rides through Delhi on an elephant with two British Officers behind him to do him honor that the King has a retinue to attend him and invites British Officers who visit him and that several leaders of the rebellion are in custody unharmed - ask Chief Commissioner by letter if this be true and say that the Governor General in Council desires that no honor may be shown to the King or ^{to} any of his Family and that all his Family and other leaders concerned in the rebellion may be tried without delay and punished according to their deserts.

The King and his family are to be kept close prisoners.
