By the Governor General's orders, the following telegram just received from the Commander in Chief's Head Quarters dated La Martinere 15<sup>th</sup> March is forwarded for information -

" From Head Quarters Camp La Martinere - 15<sup>th</sup> March -

To Allahabad

From the Commr in Chief

To the Governor General

It was reported in the afternoon of yesterday, after the fall of the Kesar Bagh, that the enemy were streaming out of the city in vast numbers in the direction of Sundela. Up to the present moment there are still rebels in the City, but I have no reliable information - Brigadier Campbell, who was well placed on the left of the Alum Bagh position, started in pursuit at two P.M.

this morning with a very strong brigade of Cavalry and two troops of horse Artillery. Brigadier General Sir Hope Grant advances towards Secapone this day with the view of intercepting fugitives, who may be turned off by Brigadier Campbell's movement. He has with him one thousand Sobres and two troops of horse Artillery. He will be followed tomorrow by an Infantry Brigade and heavy Artillery. He is directed to halt at Secapone for instructions. This is the direct road to Boluleund. Her Majesty's 75<sup>th</sup> Regt. a very weak Corps, has been ordered to leave Cawnpore tomorrow en route for Meerut."
