Nepal Residency, the 28th of April 1859.

Sir,

I have the honor to forward for submission to His Excellency the Right Honorable the Governor General in Council an abstract translation of an urzee from General Budri Nursing to Maharajah Jung Bahadur, dated the 17th of April 1859. The tone of which is far less bitter than that of his former communications.

2. The General reports the severe illness of Birjis Kudur, and that he thinks that the Begum wishes to pass thro' Nepal, to proceed via Ladakh to Succa - an impossible journey, in my opinion for her to undertake, or that she wishes to know exactly what her fate will be if she throws herself upon the mercy of the British Government.

3. I have forwarded a copy of this letter as usual thro' Sir Hope Grant to the Chief of the Staff for communication to the Commander in Chief.
