Note.—Telegrams to the Secretary of State commence with the word "Foreign," followed by the word "Secret" in the case of cypher messages which, to whomever sent, must, under certain conditions, also be paraphrased. Official telegrams are always numbered, but numbers are never telegraphed over Foreign lines. "Demi-official" and "Personal" telegrams begin with those words. Copies of all telegrams to the Secretary of State are supplied at once to the Private Secretary to the Viceroy. Post copies of telegrams are only issued in death sentence cases, and then under the signature of an officer of the department.
