Requests sanction to the Maharaj Rana of Dholpur and the Maharani paying a visit to Simla about the end of April and stopping here for the whole of the hot weather.

The Maharaj Rana and the Maharani visited Simla last year as also in the year 1912.

Last year the Maharani spent the whole of the hot weather up here while the Maharaj Rana stayed "until the rains". In submitting the case for His Excellency's sanction Sir Henry McMahon noted as follows :-

"The fact that the ^{Maha}Raj Rana of Dholpur owns a house in Simla which he is not in the habit of letting, and that therefore his visit to Simla with a small household cannot be said to add to the over-crowding of that place - makes his case differ somewhat from that of other Chiefs.

"The proposal might perhaps be approved".

His Excellency agreed and the Maharaj Rana was allowed to come to Simla. His Highness was accompanied last year by 5 ~~XXXX~~ officers and 40 followers. This year he proposes to bring 7 Sardars and 34 followers. The visit may, perhaps,
