Terms granted to the Maharajah Dulceep
Sing Bahadour, on the part of the Honble East
India Company, by Henry Piers Elliot Esq^r,
Foreign Secretary to the Government of India,
and Lieutenant Colonel Sir Henry Montgomery
Lawrence K. C. B. Resident in virtue of full
powers vested in them by the Right Honble
James, Earl of Dalhousie Knight of the most
ancient and most noble Order of the Thistle,
one of Her Majesty's most Honble Privy Counsellors
Governor General appointed by the Honble East
India Company to direct and control all their affairs
in the East Indies, and accepted on the part of
His Highness the Maharajah, by Raja Tej Sing,
Raja Deena Nath, Phaces Nidhan Sing, Subcar
Korodeen, Gunder Sing, Agent of Sirdar Shere
Sing Sindhanwalla, and Sirdar Lall Sing, Agent
and son of Sirdar Ulthar Sing Kulkarnwalla,
Members of the Council of Regency, invested with
full powers and authority on the part of His High-
ness.

I. His Highness the Maharajah Dulceep
Sing shall resign for himself, his heirs and his
successors, all rights, title and claim to the
sovereignty

sovereignty of the Punjab, or to any sovereign
Power whatever.

II. All the property of the State of
whatever description and wheresoever found, shall
be confiscated to the Honble East India Company,
in part payment of the debt due by the State
of Lahore to the British Government and of the
expenses of the War.

III. The Gem called the Koh-i-noor which
was taken from Shah Shooja ool-Moolk by
Maharaja Runjeet Sing, shall be surrendered
by the Maharajah of Lahore to the Queen of
England.

IV. His Highness Duleep Sing shall
receive from the Honble East India Company,
for the support of himself, his relatives and
the servants of the State, a pension not less
than four and not exceeding five lacs of
Company's Rupees per annum.

V. His Highness shall be treated with
respect and honor, he shall retain the title of
Maharajah Duleep Sing Bahadour, and he
shall continue to receive during his life such
portion of the above named pension as may
be allotted to himself personally, provided
he shall remain obedient to the British
Government and shall reside at such place
as the Governor General of India may select.
